<b>School Details:</b>	CBS Kilkenny is a Voluntary Roman Catholic Secondary School under the Trusteeship and the Patronage of the Edmund Rice Schools Trust. The School is grant aided by the Department of Education & Skills and is a single sex (boys) school.
<b>School Management:</b>	The Board of Management of CBS Kilkenny is a statutory Board appointed pursuant to the provisions of the Education Act 1998.

## **Mission Statement**

Inspired by its founder, CBS Kilkenny aims to provide Catholic education in the Edmund Rice tradition. The school endeavours to be a caring Christian Community which promotes to the best of its ability the personal, spiritual, physical and intellectual development of its students.

## **Ethos**

As an Edmund Rice School, CBS Kilkenny seeks to promote the five key elements of an Edmund Rice School as espoused by the ERST Charter:

- Nurturing faith, Christian spirituality and Gospel-based values
- Promoting partnership in the school community
- Excelling in teaching and learning
- Creating a caring school community
- Inspiring transformational leadership.

## **Students with Special Educational Needs (S.E.N.)**

With the mission statement above as its guiding principal, the school believes that all students should be valued equally irrespective of individual needs or differences. The school is committed to providing an environment which enables all students to progress towards achieving their potential. Inclusion to this end needs a whole school approach. Our school culture acknowledges values and celebrates excellence.

## **Relevant Legislation**

The Education Act (1998) obliges schools to meet S.E.N. of all students including the exceptionally able.

## **Aim**

The aim of this policy is to provide a framework for the identification and ongoing support of exceptionally able/gifted students to ensure that they have the opportunity to achieve their full potential.

## **Objectives**

- To help support these students avail of activities which will allow them achieve their full potential
- To encourage these students to become independent learners.
- To provide opportunities for these students to work together especially in the context of extra-curricular activities and competitions and thus reduce the potential for isolation.

## **Definitions**

### **Definition of Gifted, Talented and Exceptionally Able:**

- Gifted and talented students encompass the top 5-10% of students nationally and the exceptionally able make up the top 2% of students nationally. We recognize that a large percentage of our students fall within these categories.
- Gifted refers to students who achieve or have the ability to achieve at a level significantly in advance of their year group nationally, in one or more subjects in the state curriculum.
- Talented refers to students who have this ability or potential in arts, music, P.E., sport or creative arts.
- Exceptionally able refers to the most able of the gifted and talented students.

## **Identification**

We aim to identify gifted, talented and exceptionally able students using a variety of methods.

- We identify gifted students by analysis of performance data from entrance assessment tests and other assessments during their school life.
- We identify talented students by teachers' analysis of students in music, art and P.E.
- We identify our exceptionally able students by:  
Prior attainment (1st yr. assessments), as well as via teacher recommendation;  
Internal assessment and examination results are also used.
- We promote the early identification of gifted, talented, and exceptionally able students, using information passed on by primary schools and the exchange of information within the school.
- Teachers will be encouraged to use their professional judgment and experience through observation of student's rates of progress in acquiring relevant knowledge, skills and understanding.

## **Record-Keeping**

- Information regarding exceptionally able students is put on the public staff folder.
- Parents-Guardians are informed.
- Records are reviewed to monitor if students are achieving their potential.

## **Provision/Curriculum Planning**

Provision within the school and beyond:

We aim within the structure of the school to:

- Ensure that all students are suitably challenged in all lessons so that gifted, talented and exceptionally able students make appropriate levels of progress.
- Provide the opportunities for differentiated work
- Develop and provide opportunities for extension work / projects.
- Provide opportunities for professional development of teachers when available to inform teaching strategies.
- Provide a range of extra- curricular opportunities to encourage talent to flourish.
- Promote the development of autonomous learning by allowing students to organise their own work, to carry out tasks unaided, evaluate their work and become self - critical.

### **Teacher / student skill development across the curriculum:**

We recognise that all students are entitled to develop their potential to the full. As a result we believe in promoting challenges for all students.

- We will endeavour to promote this development through the enhancement of the teachers own awareness and skills.
- We will ensure the development of questioning, thinking and problem solving skills.
- We will provide opportunities to develop effective research techniques, library and I.C.T. skills.  
We will encourage the development of communication skills.
- We will promote a culture of pride in success.
- We will encourage and celebrate the expression of special abilities - musical, sporting, theatrical and artistic through presentations, commendations and the awarding of certificates at appropriate times during the school year.

### **Differentiation (for the gifted, talented and exceptionally able)**

- Students are encouraged to be autonomous learners.
- Students are provided with opportunities to work with like-minded students.
- Students and parents are informed about C.T.Y.I.
- Students are promoted for and encouraged to take up opportunities in:
  - Applied Maths
  - Maths Olympiad
  - Science Olympiad
  - Bebras computing competition
  - Linguistic Olympiad
  - Codorodojo
- Highest achievement in State exams, individual subjects and extracurricular activities are promoted through as many media channels as possible and promoted throughout the school as positive.
- Extra-curricular activities such as science and maths quizzes, debating and public speaking are promoted to these students.
- Resources are made available in the school library and I.T. applications for the development of these students are identified.
- Scholarships for third level are highlighted through careers classes and at parent information evenings.
- Kilkenny C.B.S. offers a unique scholarship programme which supports students to study Business in the Quinn School of Business in U.C.D. The Scholarship, funded by Mr. Tony O' Brien is a great incentive for highly able students.

### **Continuous Professional Development (CPD)**

The school may, from time to time as appropriate and dependent on resources, assign staff training days or allow staff to attend in service to support staff in the implementation of this policy.
